Your class tuition includes 25 pounds of clay. Additional clay can be purchased from the School at \$12 per 25 pound bag. We have a variety of different types of clay. All clays fire to Cone 4 to Cone 10 in temperature. Firings and glaze firings done at the School are done at Cone 5 to Cone 6.

Bisque firings are also included in your tuition. A materials fee will be assessed per piece for glaze firings. Glaze firings include firings done in the electric, raku, or pit fire kilns. Firing fees are based on the size (cubic inch) of your piece.
