SUPPLIES THAT THE STUDENTS NEED TO BRING:

Some kind of wooden box (more than one please!) Any size up to the maximum of a typical orange crate.(an old weathered box is sometimes the best). Old metal box if you have one.

Found objects: An assortment of non-precious objects that you will alter (can be already broken and should contain a variety of materials). These can include buttons, pop caps, pop cans, rusty tin cans, bullet shells, shells, bits of drift wood, beach pebbles, broken plastic toys, (broken anything is good), parts from electronics (all types), pieces of cloth or clothing (zippers, snaps, etc.), old string, thread and needle to sew cloth and buttons into pieces (if you bring that type of material

Photos (any kind of images they find they can include and alter) including those from magazines or newspapers. Some old magazines that have some interesting pictures and type.

Some cheap artist paint brushes. Pen and pencil to draw into work and keep notes (Note pad too.)

At least 6 metal cans (steel and aluminum) of variety of sizes and shapes (the more interesting the shapes and labels the better.) Some of these should have labels that are painted on the cans rather than those with paper labels. Such as pop cans, sardine cans, tomato paste, olive oil rectangular cans, tomato cans etc..... (cans that contain text, imagery, and colors that can be used creatively in the finished piece).

Other various supplies: can opener, bottle cap opener, tin snips or shears or scissors or all of these, Exacto knife or single edge razor blade, small flat slot blade screw driver (1/4" wide best), small hammer, wire snips, small size (2 tube) 5 minute epoxy.

A block of scrap wood at least 3/4" x 5" x 8" or bigger. (this will be used to cut, punch, hammer upon to protect any work surface you work upon.)

OPTIONAL: Bring any jewelry tools you have for jewelry making. Basic: Square, round, chain nose pliers, jewelry sawframe, 1/2 rd and rd jewelry files, large 1/2 rd 8"L hand file, small ball peen hammer for riveting, scribe (or sharpened nail), ruler, jeweler's sawblades #1 AND #6/0.

OPTIONAL: Other types of carpenter tools, screw guns, pliers, hammer, etc.

OPTIONAL: Any scraps (not big sheets) of copper or brass
