Inexpensive or Recycled Items

- Gallon water container, something with a wide mouth
- Freezer paper
- Plastic wrap
- Plastic tablecloth
- Viva and ONLY Viva brand paper towels
- Old clothes for you to wear
- Notebook and pencil
- Spray bottles
- Ruler
- Masking tape
- Rubbing alcohol
- Two or three small plastic containers
- Lots and lots of enthusiasm... don't leave home without it!

Quality Items

- Acrylic Paint, Golden **Fluid** Acrylics, one oz. size is large enough. If you can't get Golden, buy other brands of transparent or semi-transparent acrylic paint but please no Liquitex Brand. Must have colors... Phthalo Blue, Quinacridone Crimson, Hansa Yellow medium, Paynes Gray, Zinc White, Black, and other colors you like.

- Acrylic matte medium, any brand will do
- Gesso, something thicker in consistency if you can get it
- Brushes: square tip brushes in a variety of sizes. Buy less expensive ones with several in one package. For larger brushes Loew-Cornell has a three pack of 1", 2" and 3".
- Paper: 4 sheets of 140# cold press watercolor paper. I suggest Fabriano Artistico brand.
- Canvases: 3-5 all the same size or a variety of sizes, for example: 10' x 10", 11" x 14", 13" x 12" and 9" x 12". If you buy the deeper style 1 1/2" to 2 3/4" (edge measurement) there is no need for framing which can save on time and money.
